### **First Response Personnel**

- Central Catholic Athletic Trainer
- Head and Assistant Coaches

#### **Emergency Equipment**

- ✓ AED on wall outside Classroom 12
- ✓ Team Sports First Aid Kit
- ✓ Ice machine and bags in laundry room or Training Room
- ✓ Crutches and splints in Training Room, as available

#### **Emergency Communication**

- Cell phone
- Landline in Training Room (503-235-3138, ext. 1256) or in Classroom 12

#### **Roles of First on the Scene**

- 1. Control Scene. Gain access to the injured person(s). Coach
- 2. Initial Check to determine responsiveness: consciousness, breathing, pulse status.
- 3. Immediate Care by Highest Trained Staff
- Activate Emergency Medical Services (Ambulance/ Fire/ Police): Call 9-1-1. Provide name of victim(s), school address, phone number being used, condition of injured, assistance already provided, and other information requested by dispatcher. Highest Trained Staff or designee
- 5. Notify athlete's parent or guardian. Asst. Coach
- 6. Travel with athlete to hospital. Asst. Coach, Parent, or parent designee
- Communicate details of incident with school. Call Athletic Director on her cell, 503-969-5942. Document using Archdiocese Accident Report Form within 48-hours. *Head Coach or Athletic Trainer*

#### **EMS Access**

Designate individual to meet EMS at building's Gym entrance and escort them to the scene.
