Role(s) of First on the Scene

- 1. Control Scene (gain access to athlete). Coach
- 2. Initial Check (to determine responsiveness: breathing, consciousness, pulse status) and Immediate Care of injured athlete. **Highest Trained Staff Present/Head Coach**
- 3. Activate Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Call 9-1-1. (Ambulance, Fire, Police). **Asst. Coach or his designee.** Provide name, address, phone number being used, condition athlete, assistance provided, and other information requested by operator.
- 4. Notify athlete's parent/guardian. Asst. Coach
- 5. Travel with athlete to the hospital. Asst. Coach, Parent, or designee
- 6. Communicate details of incident with School: a) Call AD with-in 2 hours. b) Document incident on school's Archdiocese Accident Report From and submit to Athletic Department within 2 school days. c) Email that AT within 48 hours. **Head Coach**

EMS Access

Designate individual to meet emergency services at gate and escort to injured person(s).
